Youth Mission Trip to Guatemala

It is hard to believe that I am in my third year as the Director of Youth. I am so thankful for this church and everything it does in and out of our community. The youth committee, witness committee, and I have been discussing an International Mission Trip since the beginning of my time on staff. That time came, and I will be forever grateful to those that allowed, supported, encouraged, and funded this opportunity. This mission trip was possible due to the generosity of the Scott Fund. Thank you to everyone that helped along the way.

Thirteen of us committed our Spring Break to go on a mission trip to Guatemala with Ahava Ministries. Students chose this experience instead of going to the beach or spending time with friends. Chaperones took off work. Every single one of us would do it all over again.

Ahava is known as a feeding ministry, but they are not just feeding their stomachs. Ahava is feeding their souls. Yes, they provide meals to around 150 women and children three days a week. And for some of them, these are the only three meals they get in a week. They also teach the Bible and guide them to spread God's Word. We were asked to lead a VBS for the women and children. We made crafts, watched Spanish videos, and sang songs in Spanish & English. Shannon taught a lesson in Spanish; students took turns praying and reading scripture in Spanish. We had a movie night with hotdogs and popcorn. We painted fingernails and took polaroid pictures, and it was fantastic! BUT, it was the moments in between that were soul shaking. We went down there to share the love of Christ, but oh my, did they love us back! They showed US a love that was unjudgmental and thankful. A love that didn't matter if we spoke the same language because we are all part of God's family.

We also installed six wood-burning stoves and handed out 600 pounds of rice and beans in the community. They were so thankful for those \$150 stoves and the \$1 worth of rice and beans. We installed stoves on dirt floors of people's homes, while the recipients sliced watermelon, opened bottles of coke, handed out cookies, and shared what little they had with us in appreciation. They welcomed us into their homes made of dirt, tin, and sheets with a warmth that would put Greenwood's hospitality to shame (and Greenwood knows hospitality)!

One of the things asked when planning a mission trip out of the country is, "Why go out of the country when we have so many needs right here in our community?" I knew it was important to offer this opportunity to our youth, and I strongly encouraged it. Having never been on an international mission trip I would have said something along the line as, "The world is so big and it is good to expose our youth to the different challenges outside of what we know. It is important to get away from our everyday distractions to serve in unfamiliar cultures." While my answer to this question is still true, there's way more to it than that. What I came to KNOW deep down is that the people we met are the SAME in Christ. The people in Santa Elena have different struggles; poverty, corruption, hunger. But they love the same, and God loves them the same. Each one of us left Guatemala with a new insight about God and His people. Each one of us felt God's presence in a new way. My prayer is that we can use what we learned and share it with the people of our community -- those who need to experience the power of God's love.



While we are back home living our lives, the work of the people at Ahava doesn't stop. Shane, Bill, Pamela, Mario, Rosario, Lourdes, Rosario, and Andy, we are praying for you and the work you do day in and day out.



SESSION HIGHLIGHTS March 2024

- 1. Heard a report from Elder Mike Sturdivant, Chair of the Endowment Committee. He went over the various funds that are under the Committee's control and explained how the money in those funds is invested. Current members of the Endowment Committee are Miller Arant (2024), Kelli Stainback (2025), Ryan Strawbridge (2026), Don Brock (2027), and Floyd Melton III (2028).
- 2. Approved Elder Sturdivant's recommendation transferring \$10,000 from the McKinnon Fund to the Outreach Foundation.
- 3. Approved Elder Sturdivant's recommendation that \$19,365 of Endowment Funds be allocated as follows: \$3,500 to local benevolences; \$6,795 to undesignated benevolences; \$2,445 to capital improvements; \$1,590 to local handicapped projects; \$2,980 to the Outreach Foundation; \$370 to each of the following: Prison Ministry, Community Food Pantry, Norma Gelman "Christian Faith Ministries," and Our Daily Bread; \$575 to Palmer Home. Funds going to local and undesignated benevolences were referred to the Witness Committee to determine where those funds should be spent.
- 4. Approved Elder Sturdivant's recommendation that \$112,759.29 be transferred out of the Scott Fund and referred to the Witness Committee to determine where those funds should be spent.
- 5. Approved a gift of \$2,000 from Barrett and Emmie Daugherty to the Endowment Fund.
- 6. Approved adopting the Endowment Committee's report.
- 7. Approved Jen Wilkins' "God of Creation" for the Tuesday morning Bible Study.
- 8. Approved Allison Pillow as a member of the Christian Education Committee, Class of 2027.
- 9. Approved payment to Nix Electric for repair and replacement of ballasts and light fixtures in the Church Parlor in the amount of \$4,289.63.
- 10. Approved reimbursing Elizabeth Melton \$1,487.30 for the purchase of a chandelier for the Church Office Foyer. This amount will be taken from Design Team Funds.
- 11. Approved the use of the Sanctuary for an Eagle Scout Court of Honor ceremony on April 21, 2024.
