SPOTLIGHT ON "POTTER AND CLAY MINISTRIES"

We are featuring one of our mission agencies in our newsletter each month. We want the congregation to be knowledgeable about our agencies to tell others what we are doing for the Lord!

Jordan Walker and Rebecca Gasson were born and raised in Brandon, Mississippi. After

completing degrees in Elementary Education from Mississippi State and Ole Miss respectively, Jordan and Rebecca taught 3rd grade for two years before moving to Northwest Haiti in June of 2015. Together, they founded Potter and Clay Ministries in mid-2017 where they serve families across Northwest Haiti. The following is information about each program their ministry sponsors.

Potter & Clay Ministries provides **malnutrition treatment** to children from across Northwest Haiti. Through loving care and support, we strive not only to keep babies alive but help their families thrive. All of Potter & Clay's programs and staff work together to provide immediate assistance to malnourished children, as well as support their families in an effort to prevent relapse and provide hope for a brighter future. Children over 6 months are treated with ready -to-eat-therapeutic food called Medika Mamba, or peanut butter medicine. A \$70 box of Medika Mamba provides treatment for a child recovering from malnutrition.



Access to **clean water** is a problem that many families across the world face, which leads to many other health and financial problems. For just \$25, you can provide a family with a bucket filter kit that will provide clean drinking water for everyone in the household!

Formula: Potter & Clay Ministries' Formula Program provides weekly formula, well-checks with a nurse, and caregiver education to each family in our program. It takes \$60 per month to provide these services to each family.

Education is a key part of development for every child. Because there is no public education in Haiti, we strive to support families in our community through school sponsorship. It costs around \$115 to send a child to school for a year. For many families in Haiti, the cost of education is too much. At Potter & Clay Ministries, it's important to us that we provide healthy ingredients that can be found in everyday Haitian life. One way that we do that is through our **agriculture program**. Since the beginning of 2020, Potter & Clay Ministries has been developing our agriculture program which will help improve families' access to nutritious food as well as a way to generate income for their families.
