Your Turkey Earthquake Outreach

On February 6, a 7.8 earthquake rocked southeast Turkey and northeast Syria. There is a Presbyterian Church in Aleppo that opened the doors of Aleppo College (a school run by the church) as a relief center. Within hours, over 350 had sought shelter and supplies there. A picture below shows a woman showing a young girl a sleeping bag at this shelter, and a scene from within the shelter. We have seen the news reports of people were displaced from their homes in the heart of winter, mourning the loss of their homes, their families, their friends. Mark Mueller, Director of the Outreach Foundation, made an emergency appeal for Presbyterians to help. He wrote, "Paul writes in the 8th chapter of Romans, 'For I am persuaded that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.' I cling to Paul's words today more than ever. 36,000 people have perished in the recent earthquake in Turkey and Syria...yet we remain resilient and committed as Christians because we live with hope in Jesus Christ. He is our advocate. Claiming Paul's words, we confidently respond in word or deed to the work of Christ in the world." Mueller wrote this emergency appeal email on February 15. Our witness committee had already voted two days prior on February 13 to send an emergency missions check of \$10,200 to help the Turkey earthquake victims. I am so grateful by the compassionate heart of our Witness Committee that they were moved to help our Presbyterian friends affected by the earthquake. I texted news of our help to Tom Boone (who works for the Outreach Foundation and visited our church recently) and he was in Germany on the way to Turkey. He was so thankful to hear of the relief from our church. Please keep praying for the victims of that tragic earthquake, and praise God that you are part of the efforts to help them!

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS FEBRUARY 2023

- 1. Elder Trish Rodgers, Chair of the Officer Nominating Committee, reported that the committee had met and had developed a slate of potential candidates. Members of the committee are in the process of contacting the persons nominated to inquire as to their willingness to serve.
- 2. Dr. Andrew Chaney and Elders Glenn and Susan Beckham represented this church at the ECO National Gathering which was held January 30 February 1, 2023 at St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church in Newport Beach, CA. Susan gave a report to the session.
- 3. Approved calling a congregational meeting on March 19, 2023 for the election of officers for the Class of 2026.
- 4. Approved Ray Smithee assuming additional duties of office administrator / manager at a salary of \$1,000.00 per month, the exact duties to be agreed upon in consultation with the Pastor, Ray, and the Staff Support Committee.
- 5. Approved changing Lonnie Love's employment status from contract labor to hourly employee.
- 6. Approved amending the 2023 Budget to increase interest income by \$12,000.00 and salary expense by \$12,000.00.
- 7. Approved accepting an unrestricted gift of \$1,000.00 from Frank Jarman.
- 8. Approved Deep Down Faith by Dr. Cornelius Plantinga, Jr., for the Youth Parents' Sunday School class taught by Youth Director Whitney Avritt.
- 9. Noted Caroline Strawbridge will serve as the CE representative on the Youth Scholarship Committee.
- 10. Approved payment of \$10,200.00 to the Outreach Foundation to be used for earthquake relief in Turkey. This is the remainder of the 2022 benevolences.
- 11. Noted Susan Beckham will serve as the Worship and Music Committee's representative on the Youth Scholarship Committee.
- 12. Noted FPK registration for the 2023 -2024 school year is underway with 42 children currently registered.
- 13. Noted Barrett Daugherty will serve as the Kindergarten Board's representative on the Youth Scholarship Committee.
- 14. Approved the proposal developed by R19 Architecture to use the Mullin property as a drop-off and parking area for the Education Building / Kindergarten.
- 15. The Security Issues Committee met with David Williford, owner of Safe Shooter, Inc. in Leland on Sunday, February 12. He is advising the committee on security improvements to the church facilities.
- 16. Noted Trish Rodgers will serve as the Security Committee's representative on the Youth Scholarship Committee.
- 17. Approved the expenditure of \$10,000.00 to acquire plans for the construction of the drop-off and parking area for the Education Building / Kindergarten. This money will come from the capital improvement restricted fund. The plans will include a cost estimate for the project.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS, continued

- 18. Approved the Columbarium Subcommittee to disseminate information to the congregation in the church newsletter, bulletin, e-mails and through informal meetings for the purpose of determining how much interest exists among church members regarding construction of a Columbarium.
- 19. Buildings & Grounds reported that the Education Building needs significant waterproofing work to stop water from entering the building. A quote has been received from Dixie Roofing for \$75,000.00 for sealing mortar joints that are allowing water to seep in behind the brick walls. The Chair pointed out that the church will soon have to make a long term investment in maintaining the buildings.

Congregational Meeting

The Session has called a Congregational Meeting for **Sunday, March 19**, immediately following worship for the purpose of hearing and acting upon the report of the Nominating Committee regarding the election of elders and deacons for the Class of 2026.

While the cisterns are being built (an easy process of mixing cement) you would visit with the local villagers. The group would stay at a four-room guest house in Xpujil which is a six hour drive south from Cancun. Each room has two twin beds, two hammocks, fans, and a bathroom with a shower.
