Congregational Meeting/September 23, 2018/11:00 a.m.: The Session has called a Congregational Meeting for this day and time, in accordance with the Settlement Agreement with St. Andrew Presbytery, PCUSA. On this day this congregation will discuss and have a historic vote which will determine this congregation's future denominational affiliation. The vote will be on the question: **Shall FPC, Greenwood request dismissal to ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians, another Reformed body?** The Session is recommending that the congregation vote to request dismissal to ECO since this is the only way this congregation may secure clear title to all its property. The quorum for this meeting is one-third of the members on the active roll. Two thirds of those present and voting on this day would be needed to retain all of the congregation's property, but it would surrender its membership in the PCUSA. There are no absentee ballots. The vote will take place by secret ballot on September 23, 2018.
